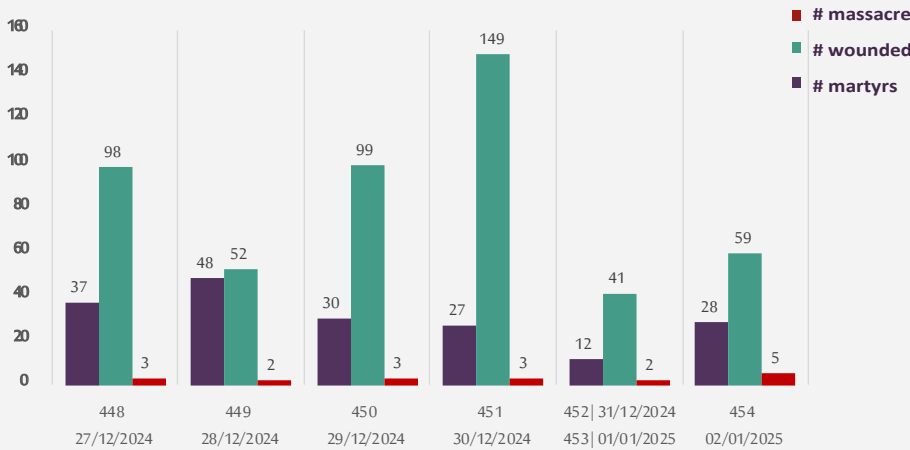

Significant Humanitarian Facts



Over the past two days, one thousand and 542 tents accommodating displaced individuals in the Gaza Strip have been inundated with rainwater, leading to numerous cases of "cold shivering" among the residents. This situation has intensified their suffering, which has already been exacerbated by the ongoing violence perpetrated by Israel for the past 15 months. Rescue teams have reported that hundreds of tents are flooded with rainwater reaching levels exceeding 30 centimeters. (3)

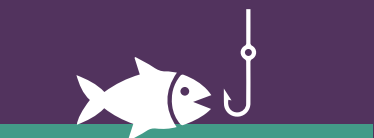


Recent assessments of water quality have indicated concerning levels of microbial contamination. A United Nations mission that recently visited areas housing displaced persons in Gaza City observed extremely inadequate conditions regarding water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH). (5)



The occupancy rate of neonatal beds has surpassed %100, and there is a critical shortage of essential medical equipment, including ventilators, phototherapy machines, CPAP devices, and life-saving supplies such as antibiotics, intravenous immunoglobulin, total parenteral nutrition, and surfactants necessary for neonatal care.(5)

Risks threatening Gaza Strip



Gaza's fishing industry, which previously provided livelihoods for 110,000 individuals, has incurred losses amounting to 84\$ million due to the destruction of %72 of its fishing assets.(5)



Approximately 7,700 newborns are currently deprived of essential life-saving medical care as the capacity for neonatal services continues to decline throughout the Gaza Strip, especially in North Gaza, which accounted for nearly 60% of all neonatal hospital beds before October 2023. (6)



In recent weeks, there has been a significant increase in the extensive devastation of residential areas and civilian infrastructure, encompassing hospitals, roads, and utilities such as electricity, water, and sewage systems. Entire regions have been rendered uninhabitable, reduced to mere rubble, jeopardizing the long-term well-being, lives, and stability of the residents of Gaza.(7)
